

Reflections on the Eucharist From "Mystery of the Altar" St. Madeleine Sophie Barat (1779-1865) pg. 146

St. Madeleine spoke to her Novices of the Society of the Sacred Heart on Christ's exceeding love for each person in the sacrament of the Eucharist encouraging them to generously return love for love: I spoke to them of the infinite love of our Blessed Lord in instituting this Divine Eucharist and on the tender and loving words He spoke to His Apostles during the Last Supper. How, I asked, can we help loving Him who has given us such unheard of marks of love? It was to us, as well as to His Apostles that He said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer" (Luke 22:15), that is, to give Myself to you as your food. Yes, the Jews are about to put Me to death. I must leave you, but My love cannot abide the separation. I shall institute this Divine Sacrament and thus always remain with you and with those who will come after you until the end of time. Oh, Sisters, shall we still be unmoved? Shall we still refuse Him anything? Can we keep anything back? It would be monstrous ingratitude!" Time passed quickly while speaking on so engrossing a subject. It was ten o'clock, and I told them it was time to go; though they were ready to stay all night. Nevertheless, duty prevailed. And before separating, we gave each other the kiss of peace.
