

Reflections on the Eucharist From "Mystery of the Altar", St. Columbanus (who inherited the Catholic Faith of St. Patrick) page 80

Even as the Eucharist is received, it can never be exhausted, for it is the glorified Body of Christ, risen from the dead. Consider the source of the fountain; bread comes down to us from the same place, since the same one is the bread and the fountain, the only-begotten Son, our God, Christ the Lord, for whom we should always hunger. For the Lord is sweet and agreeable; rightly then let us eat and drink yet remain hungry and thirsty, since he is our food and drink, but can never be wholly eaten and consumed. Though He may be eaten, He is never consumed; one can drink of Him and He is not diminished because our bread is eternal and our fountain is sweet and everlasting. Hence, the Prophet says: "You, who thirst, go to the fountain." He, Christ, is the fountain for those who are thirsty but are never fully satisfied.
