

June 11, 2022 – Pentecost 2025 Reflections on the Eucharist

"Becoming Eucharistic People – The Hope and Promisof Parish Life" Timothy P. O'Malley, (pg.18)

At Mass, it is the entire Paschal Mystery – Christ's Life, Death, Resurrection and Ascension – that is remembered and celebrated. The Church comes forth from this Eucharistic mystery – the self-givin love of Christ that gathers all men and women into this common act of worship. Liturgy is the work of God UPON the people bringing us into a communion of love that we ourselves could never create. Liturgy is a gift. And yet, the human being is not left out of this transformation. Human beings have a role to play because the gift that Jesus gives in the Blessed Sacrament is meant to b received by mere mortals. The gift of Christ upon the altar woos us to offer that same gift of love in return. After all, it is bread and wine, symbols of creation that are transformed into Christ's Body and Blood. Pope Benedict XVI notes that this transformation is a process and that we have a rol to play in it. We give ourselves in return to the Go who gave Himself in total love. And the very shap of history, of time and space, is changed because a Jesus's love that is still offered on every altar throughout the world. Everything that is human must become divine.

The Lord Jesus, on the night before he suffered on the cross, shared one last meal with his disciples. During this meal our Savior instituted the sacrament of his Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages and to entrust to the Church a memorial of his death and resurrection. The Institution of the Eucharist is written down in the four Gospels below:
